Eliminate the Digital Divide" Grant awarded for computer equipment & training

A grant from the Illinois Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity through the College of Lake County has allowed Mano a Mano to update its existing computer lab to become a Community Technology Center. Qualified staff will train low-income individuals in this part of the county. Students will have access to technology and computer training, including job readiness classes using Illinois WorkNet, the free portal that provides career, education, and work support information for Illinois residents and businesses.

The primary learning objectives include understanding basic technology terminology and equipment, using computers and productivity software to organize and create information, and utilizing computer and communications software to access and transmit information.

The Center will provide general access to computers to the public as well as computer classes and job readiness workshops that will include sessions on resume writing, career planning and job search. Students will also be linked to other advanced educational programs as well as Mano a Mano's GED and ESL classes.
